

START DRIVING TOUR DIRECTIONS START: Bellevue Hospital, use CR 302 to drive towards the barn and get the closest views of the mural.



Historic Barn - 757 Steam Engine Barn 1400 West Main Street Bellevue, Ohio 44811 (419) 332-4470 sanduskycounty.org

Painted in June of 2022, the 757 Steam Engine mural welcomes visitors to the Bellevue, Ohio and Bellevue Hospital Corridor. 757 was built in 1944 by the Lima Locomotive Works for the New York, Chicago & St. Louis Railroad. The engines soon became an icon of the railroad. It was retired in Bellevue, Ohio, in 1958 and is now on display at the Mad River & NKP Railroad Museum in Bellevue. This barn was sponsored by The Bellevue Hospital.

CONTINUING TO BARN 2: The 2nd barn is located West of Fremont on US 20. Leaving the Bellevue Barn, Continue on (US 20) West, stay to the right at the split with (US 6, SR 53) South. Just past mile marker 19 and (CR 106) you will see the barn to your right. Time from previous location: 17 Minutes, 14.5 Miles.



America 250 Barn 3888 West State Street Fremont, Ohio 43420 (419) 332-4470 sanduskycounty.org

Painted in June of 2024, the America 250 Barn was a partnership with the America 250 Ohio-Commission and the Sandusky County Visitors Bureau. This mural commemorates the 250 year anniversary of America that takes place in 2026. This barn is owned by David and Ingrid Miarer, and is located at 3888 West State Street (US 20) Fremont.

CONTINUING TO BARN 3: The 3rd barn is located West of Fremont on US 20. just about 1 mile from the America 250 Barn and is located on the same side of the road. Time from previous location: 2 Minutes, 1 Mile.



Historic Barn - Sandusky County Bicentennial Barn Completed in the spring of 2019, the Sandusky County Bicentennial barn mural was painted just 4246 West State Route 20 Fremont, Ohio 43420 (419) 332-4470 sanduskycounty.org

before we officially celebrated our county's bicentennial in 2020. The barn was sponsored by Terra State Community College and the Terra College Foundation. This barn is located on State Route 20 West and can be seen from east and westbound traffic since the barn has a mural on both sides.

CONTINUING TO BARN 4: Continue on (US 20) West towards Woodville/Toledo for 8.4 miles and just past the 4 mile marker, you will see the barn to your right. Immediately after passing the barn, prepare to TURN LEFT in .6 miles on Anderson Road (CR 32). Time from previous location: 9 Minutes, 8 Miles.



Historic Barn - Astronaut Tom Henricks Barn 770 East Main Street Woodville, Ohio 43469 (419) 332-4470 sanduskycounty.org

Completed in the spring of 2018, this barn was designed and dedicated to honor four-time NASA shuttle astronaut Colonel Tom Henricks, a Woodville, Ohio native. This barn is located on State Route 20 east of Woodville and can be seen when traveling in the westbound lane. This barn was sponsored by Martin Marietta.

CONTINUING TO BARN 5: After turning, CONTINUE on Anderson Road (CR 32) for approximately 5 miles to the stop sign at the intersection of (SR 600) and Anderson Road (CR 32). CONTINUE straight on Anderson Road (CR 32) and the barn is to your right and is visible from the OH 600 intersection. Time from previous location: 6 Minutes, 4.5 Miles.



Historic Barn - 9/11 - PSSM Barn 1524 County Road 32 Gibsonburg, Ohio 43431 (419) 332-4470 sanduskycounty.org

Completed in September of 2017, this barn was designed and dedicated to honor two Sandusky County residents who died on 9/11. There is also an element to honor the Public Safety Service men and women who risk their lives to keep us safe. This barn is located on County Road 32 (Anderson Rd). Barn was sponsored by an anonymous



CONTINUING TO BARN 6: CONTINUE on Anderson Road (CR 32) for approximately 2.8 miles to the stop sign at the intersection of (US 6) and Anderson Road (CR 32). TURN LEFT and follow (US 6) East 9.8 miles to the stop light at the intersection of (SR 53) and TURN LEFT continuing on (SR 53 & US 6) 1.3 miles and TURN RIGHT on Muskellunge Road, just past the round-about. At the stop sign at the intersection of West State Street and Muskellunge, CONTINUE straight through the intersection. Muskellunge becomes Christy Road, barn will be on the hillside to your left, just after the sharp left curve. Time from previous location: 20 Minutes, 15 Miles.



Historic Barn - Battle of Fort Stephenson Barn 2000 Christy Road Fremont, Ohio 43420 (419) 332-4470 sanduskycounty.org

Completed in September of 2017, this barn was designed to commemorate and depict the historic battle that took place in what is now Fremont during the War of 1812. The battle against the invading British was won by Major George Croghan with the help of his trusty cannon "Old Betsy" that can be seen in this mural design. This barn is located on Christy Road and was sponsored by Fremont Federal Credit Union.



CONTINUING TO BARN 7: CONTINUE on Christy Road for approximately 1 mile to the stop sign at the intersection of (SR 19) and Christy Road, TURN LEFT and follow (SR 19) North 2.2 miles and TURN RIGHT on Zienta-Horn Road, just after passing under the Ohio Turnpike overpass. CONTINUE on Zienta-Horn Road for .6 miles and TURN RIGHT on Fangboner Road. Shortly after you turn, you will see the barn directly in front of you from a distance. CONTINUE on Fangboner Road passing over the overpass over the Ohio Turnpike, barn is to your left. Time from previous location: 8 Minutes, 4.7 Miles.



Historic Barn - Rutherford B. Hayes Barn 3265 Fangboner Road Fremont, Ohio 43420 (419) 332-4470 sanduskycounty.org

Completed in late 2015, the Rutherford B. Hayes barn was painted to commemorate our 19th President's entrepreneurial spirit. A quote taken directly from the diary of Hayes is painted on the side of the barn, "The Bold Enterprises are the Successful Ones." The mural faces north, toward the turnpike just east of the Fangboner Road overpass and was sponsored by the Ohio History Connection and the Ohio Turnpike Commission.

STOP END OF BARN TRAIL: TURN LEFT at the Intersection immediately past the barn, (CR 89) and this will take you back to (SR 53) and the Ohio Turnpike 80/90.
